TEACHING METHODOLOGY

The objective is to measure and draw fragments of Villa Adriana, to learn from the observation and taking of measurements from the direct model. The trip to this Villa created by the Emperor Hadrian was for a long time a goal of the training trips of artists, architects and historians. During 5 days we will take measurements at the ruins of the Villa during the morning and in the afternoon we will draw in the classrooms of the Università de la Sapienza in Rome. On the first day we will have an explanation from professors and architects Pisana Posocco and Filippo Lambertucci, who know this work in depth. Two days of the trip will be dedicated to visit the city of Rome and in particular Hadrian's Rome, with works such as the Panteon or Castel Sant'Angelo, created by himself.
