To assume ship safety depends not only on her equipment but also her construction and those associated (crews, designers, companies, inspection bodies, ...).

To understand, interpret and use international conventions and other regulations in regard to maritime safety and security.

To distinguish the concept of Safety from Security and recognize onboard equipment, procedures or facilities relating to one or the other.
