Description:

In a 1989 text on relativism in the appreciation of art, Ernst Gombrich recounted that "the eminent medievalist Adolph Goldschmidt once took over Heinrich Wölfflin's seminar and opened the meeting by throwing a slide of a Dutch landscape painting on to the screen with the question: «what do you see?» «I see a horizontal, crossed by two verticals», responded one of the students. «Actually», said Goldschmidt gently, «I see a little more»". The visual knowledge sought by the former student of Wölfflin and the iconographically and historically informed knowledge that interested Goldschmidt both had an extraordinary development in the following years; the course aims to trace the development of the first, both historically and through experimentation, up to the 60s - with some extension beyond.
